NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 20 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927 [Act XVI of 1927] read with the Government of India in the late Ministry of States Notification No. 104-J, dated the 24th August, 1950 as amended, the Chief Commissioner of Tripura has been pleased to declare the Forest land comprising an area of 175.00 sq. miles situate within the Kailashahar and Dharmanagar Sub-Divisions and described by the boundary limits as specified below, a Reserved Forest to be called "Central Catchment area Reserved Forest" with effect from 10. 10. 61:—

- NORTH:—The boundary line starting from the junction of Natinmanuchara and Chhamanuchara moves along up stream of Chhamanuchara upto a distance of about 5½ miles, thence turns to the North-easterly direction and runs along one of its tributaries upto its source, then moves to the southerly direction till it meets Debachara, thence the line runs along down-stream of Debachara and then meets Manu river, thence it follows the down-stream of manu river till it meets Maldharchara, runs along up-stream of Maldharchara upto its source, then it meets the Sakhan ridge, follows Sakhan ridge to the Northerly direction upto the Serhmun peak (2180 altitude); then the line runs to the easterly direction till it meets Deo-river thence the line follows down-stream of Deo-river upto the junction of Barachara, thence runs along up-stream of Barachara, follows one of its tributaries to the northerly direction about one mile, then the line turns to the easterly direction passes through Hmunte, follows one of the tributaries of Sailut Lui and ultimately meets Sailut Lui.
 - EAST:—The boundary line between Lushai Hills and Tripura Territory upto a point on Saisih Lui on the east of Phuldungsei village, then the line proceeds north of Phuldungsei village to the ridge keeping village outside the Reserved Forest. The line then makes a detour round the village keeping the orchards and the Phuldungsei village outside R. F. and then meets the boundary line between Lushai Hills and this Territory to the north of Betling Sib (3077' altitude) and then proceeds along the boundary line;
 - SOUTH:—The inter-State Boundary between East Pakistan and this Territory upto the southern extremity of the boundary line between Khowai and Kailashahar; and
 - WEST:—The boundary line between Khowai and Kailashahar Sub-Divisions upto the source of Patimanuchara and then along Patimanuchara upto 18 junction with Natimanuchara.

NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 20 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927 (Act XVI of 1927) read with the Government of India in the Late Ministry of States Notification No. 104-J dated the 24th August, 1950 as amended, the Chief Commissioner of Tripura has been pleased to declare the forest land, comprising an area of 3.5 Sq. miles situate within the Khowai Sub-Division and described by the boundary limits as specified below, a Reserved Forest to be called "Ramchandra Ghat Reserved Forest" with effect from 10. 10. 61:—

- NORTH:—Lal-tilla Colony foot path from 13th mile of Khowai-Kalachara Road leading to the junction of Hatimara Chara and Mitinga chara by Lal-Tilla Colony.
 - EAST:—Mitinga chara upto its source, then a line to Hataibari leaving paddy field on the east as far as practicable.
- SOUTH:—A line from Hataibari to the mile post No. 11 on the Khowai-Kalachara road leaving paddy field as far as practicable, in the south.
 - WEST :- Khowai Kalachara Road from the mile post No. 11 upto Lal-tilla foot path.
