NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 20 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927 (Act XVI of 1927) read with Government of India in the Late Ministry of States Notification No. 104-J. dated, the 24th August, 1950 as amended, the Administrator of Tripura has been pleased to declare the forest land comprising an area of 14.5 sq. miles situated within Khowai Sub-Division and described by the boundary limits as specified below, a Reserved Forest to be called "Chakmaghat Reserved Forest" with effect from 5.8.64.

SOUTH:—Starting from the meeting point of Khowai river and Bhaskar Chara, the line proceeds along the down stream of Khowai river for about a mile. Then the line proceeds towards the north along the foot hills and keeping cultivated lands on the left. The line then turns towards south following the foot of the hills and keeping cultivated lands on the left. The line then proceeds towards west and then towards north along the foot of the hills and keeping cultivated land on the left till it proceeds upto Mandarbari. From there the line proceeds towards north along the foot of the hill upto Candakberi and then the line proceeds towards south along the foot of the hills to Sidubari and Chakmabari keeping cultivated lands on the left. Then the line proceeds towards westnorth, west, north east and towards west along the foot of the hills and keeping cultivated lands on the left till it reaches Toblabari.

WEST:—From Toblabari the line proceeds directly towards north, crosses the hills and crossing the Tuikarmachara, it proceeds towards north along foot of the hills upto Bandagudakbari keeping the cultivated lands on the left. Then the line proceeds generally towards north along the foot of the hills keeping cultivated lands on the left till it meets a Chara which is the foot path from Braja Mohan Bari to Gandanalia-bari.

NORTH:—The line proceeds towards east along the path on the Chara upstream upto Gandanalia-bari. Then the line proceeds towards East and North-East on the upstream of a Chara and then east along a foot path upto Gour Chandra bari. Then the line proceeds towards south, then north, then south-east and then towards north along the foot of the hills around a valley along which a tributory of Maharanichara flows. Then the line proceeds north-east along a foot path towards Kushamanibari till it meets Bhaskar chara.

EAST:—The line then proceeds down stream of Bhaskarchara till it meets the starting point at its meeting with Khowai River (part of the western boundary of Atharamura—Kalajhari R. F.)
