

NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 20 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927 (Act XVI of 1927) read with the Government of India in the late Ministry of States Notification No. 104-J, dated the 24th August, 1950 as amended, the Chief Commissioner, Tripura has been pleased to declare the Forest land comprising an area of 50.5 Sq. miles situate within the Belonia and Sabroom Sub-Divisions and described by the boundary limits as specified below, a Reserved Forest to be called, "Tekkatulsi Reserved Forest" with effect from 10. 10. 61:—

- EAST:—From the junction of Laogang and Muhuri river, the boundary line moves roughly south-east up-stream of Muhuri river upto a point where Tuigamari-chara meets Muhuri river, thence it moves roughly south-east along the foot of the hill ranges keeping itself as far as practicable between cultivable wetland on the left and foot hills on the right, then it moves roughly in the same direction and crosses Bhuratali Chara and Shilchari Chara, then it moves more or less in the same direction and along a tributary of Shilchari Chara to its source and then crosses straight west to meet Betaga Chara (which is within ½ mile of each other) and moves again in the same direction along Betaga Chara to Bar Betaga Chara till it meets Fenny river;
- SOUTH:—The boundary line follows Inter-State boundary (Fenny river) upto the junction of Meru Chara with Fenny river;
 - WEST:—the boundary line moves up-stream along Meru Chara, thence it moves more or less north-west along the foot of the hill ranges excluding as far as practicable cultivable land, keeping the hill ranges on the east, meets Muhuri giver at a distance of 2 miles 32 chains from the junction of Laogang with Muhuri river, at this point Muhuri river, turns north-west; and
- NORTH:—the boundary line moves up-stream along Muhuri river along the left bank upto the junction of Laogang and Muhuri river.
